

Portes du Soleil Ski Game: Terms and Conditions

Tuesday, 21st March & Wednesday, 22nd March 2017

The Organiser

The organiser is the "Association Internationale des Portes du Soleil", located at 1401 route de Vannes, 74390 Châtel, France – Tel + 33 (0)4 50 73 32 54, represented by Mr. Georges Coquillard, Association President.

The Portes du Soleil treasure hunt is not a race, rather a ski trek across two countries: France and Switzerland. Each skier is free to go at their own pace. Participants are expected to ski within themselves and to be conscious of their fitness levels and ski safety rules.

The participation to the Portes du Soleil treasure hunt is free if participants have bought a Portes du Soleil ski-pass for the 21st and/or 22nd March 2017, or if they own a valid Portes du Soleil ski-pass for these days.

Anyone employed directly or indirectly by the Portes du Soleil (to service the slopes or operate ski lifts) is not eligible to take part in this game.

The organiser reserves the right to modify the route chosen or to cancel the Portes du Soleil treasure hunt in the event of force majeure, a climatic event, epidemic or natural catastrophe, or indeed any other circumstance that might threaten participants' safety.

Should the Portes du Soleil treasure hunt be cancelled or halted for whatever reason by the organiser, no refunds will be given for ski-pass already purchased.

Civil liability - Insurance

Every participant should have their own personal liability insurance, meaning that any accidents during the game are the responsibility of participants involved. The organiser may not be held liable in any event.

Insurance is available from "Snowrisk" and proposed at the lifts ticket offices.

It is optional and covers first aid treatment, rescue and repatriation in the event of an accident (details at the cable car ticket office or at <http://www.snowrisk.com/>)

The organiser may not be held responsible in the event of loss, theft or damage to participants' clothing or equipment.

Clothing

We strongly recommend all participants to wear substantial amounts of warm clothing suitable for winter sports, since the weather in the mountains can change very quickly.

Behaviour

All participants must respect the usual terms and conditions that apply to those using the slopes and ski lifts, as well as any instructions given by the organiser.

To protect the natural terrain involved, participants are asked not to throw away any litter during the event.

The route crosses the French-Swiss border, so make sure you have valid ID (this applies to children as well).

Participants are also advised to carry some Euros and/or Swiss francs and a bank card.

On the snow

Every participant accepts that they have understood the risks involved in skiing; they confirm that they will only take the route indicated by the organisers and they do so with the understanding that it is at their own risk.

Ski lifts are opened from 9am to 4:30pm, participants who fail to take note of this information will have to pay to be taken back to their starter resort.

The organiser reserves the right to change the route of the game and the events programme, particularly for safety reasons.

Each participant gives their express permission for the organiser of the Portes du Soleil treasure hunt, as well as various media and other partners, to use photographs or video images on which they may appear which have been taken during the same event, for reproduction on all media supports including promotional documents and/or advertising publications.

In accordance with freedom of information legislation passed on 6th January 1978, every participant has the right to access and correct any personal data concerning them. Participants may receive commercial offers from other companies or associations via the organiser. Any participants not wishing to receive such offers should inform the organiser, giving their surname, first name and address.

Rules:

- There are 15 checkpoints located throughout the ski area's marked slopes.
- They are indicated on the Ski & Snowboard game pistes map.
- They are identifiable by a white and orange orienteering marker measuring 30cmx30cm, as well as a small hole punch.
- To qualify for a prize, participants must visit 5 checkpoints, including the one at the "Col des Portes du Soleil", as well as at least one in France and one in Switzerland.
- The prize is a 1-day Portes du Soleil ski pass valid from 22nd March 2017 to the end of the winter season 2016/2017
- You can check the 5 markers on one day or on two days but with the same game card
- If you choose to play on both days with two game cards, one for Tuesday and one for Wednesday, different markers must be checked on day 1 and day 2.
- In the event of very bad weather, the compulsory checkpoint at the "Col des Portes du Soleil" may be transferred to Lindarets (on the top of Ardent gondola: information will be pass on upstream).
